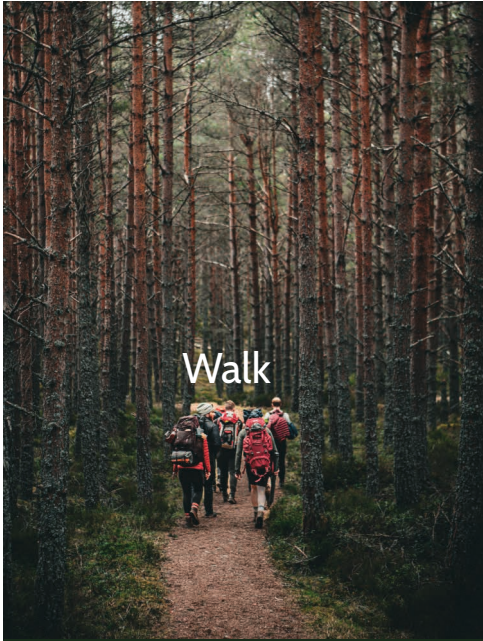

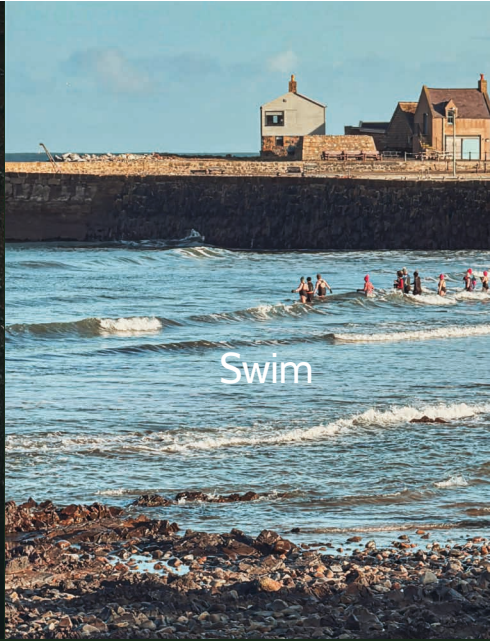

Q: What is the Gordonstoun Highland Games?

Q: How can visitors support the fundraising efforts for our nominated charities?

2026 Nominated Charity

Q: Can you tell us a little about your charity and the work you do?

A: Wild Things is an award-winning Scottish charity dedicated to overcoming educational, social and economic disadvantages through engagement with and protection of the natural world. We offer a unique range of outdoor learning and wellbeing programmes that help participants appreciate, care for and understand Scotland's spectacular environments, while gaining valuable skills and life experiences. Wild Things has been nationally recognised for its impact, including through the National Lottery's 'Heritage Heroes' award and the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service.



Q: How will your charity use the donation from the Gordonstoun Highland Games, and what impact will it have?

A: The charity sector is currently under a great deal of strain. Cuts to public sector funding, increased competition for grant funding as well as the increased cost-of-living are resulting in very challenging conditions in the third sector. As a result, Wild Things will utilise any funding to support the core running costs of the organisation - these essential nuts-and-bolts costs include our office, our minibuses and salaries for important staff members who are not ordinarily funded through grants. Without core funding, our charitable programmes would grind to halt and this essential support underpins absolutely everything we do in the community and in the natural spaces we protect.

Q: What can visitors find at your stall today?

A: Visitors will have a chance to discover a wide selection of natural curiosities including a selection of bones and skulls of native Scottish wildlife, taxidermied birds of prey as well as the wings and feet of buzzards and owls. Visitors will have a chance to examine the tracks and signs of various animals and attempt to guess what animals the tracks belong to. Visitors will also be welcomed by knowledgeable outdoor instructors to learn more about our work in communities across the north of Scotland, including our many charitable programmes for vulnerable youth and neglected but important local habitats.

Q: Do you have a message for everyone attending the Games today?

A: Wild Things' mission is to enable people of all ages and abilities to access, experience, learn about and enjoy the natural world. Whilst Gordonstoun is renowned for the high quality of its outdoor education, unfortunately, the majority of young people living in Scotland don't have the same opportunities to connect with and enjoy the stunning but fragile ecosystems on their doorstep. With increasing pressure on our natural habitats and both educational and social services, Wild Things' work is more important than ever. By supporting us, you are directly helping to ensure that young people across Scotland are provided with enriching nature-based educational experiences that simultaneously improve their wellbeing and the wellbeing of the natural world we aim to protect. Help us to nurture the next generation of young people who are environmentally aware, connected to nature and who will become the future champions of a world which cares about and acts to support a flourishing natural environment.

The Ladybird Development Group

2026 Nominated Charity



Q: How will your charity use the donation from the Gordonstoun Highland Games, and what impact will it have on your work and the people that you support?

A: Some of the families who have children that attend the Ladybird Development Group have difficulty in accessing social experiences such as going to cafes, swimming, Hydrotherapy pool, soft play areas for a number of reasons. This may include the child's reluctance to tolerate such experiences, physical disabilities, being unable to manage the child's special equipment such as portable oxygen, wheelchairs etc (often with siblings to care for as well), and this can be helped by Ladybird staff supporting their child by slowly introducing such activities. So any donation received from the Gordonstoun Highland Games would enable us to offer some of these external activities.

It is hoped that the impact of this could be life changing for some of the children and families. They may experience things they never have before and develop new skills that they never even knew they had. Integrating the children into the wider community as much as we can is not only a benefit to the people we support but it also creates more awareness and a better understanding to local people of children who live with disabilities. While we do have our own outdoor garden area the possibility of visiting more open spaces to explore nature further would have a positive impact on the health and well-being of the children.

Q: What can visitors expect to find at your stall today?

A: We will have some leaflets/posters giving information about our service along with a little PowerPoint presentation showing some of the activities that we do with the children.

Q: Do you have a message for everyone attending the Games today?

A: Good luck to everyone who is participating in the event, we hope the sun is shining for you all! Thank you also to everyone at Gordonstoun for choosing our charity and to all who have supported the event in any way. It really is appreciated by all children, parents and staff from the Ladybird Development Group.

Q: Could you provide an overview of your charity and the work that you undertake?

A: The Ladybird Development Group was set up in 1985 to care for pre-school children with Additional Support Needs. There is no other similar provision in our area for children with additional and complex needs. These conditions include physical, sensory or learning difficulties, such as those connected to Cerebral palsy, Down's Syndrome, Autism, Visual and Hearing impairments etc. Every child who attends Ladybird is referred to us by a professional agency who has concerns about their development. This may be a Health Visitor, GP, Paediatrician, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Speech Therapist or Social Worker.

These professionals visit or have regular involvement in meeting the needs of the children and offer guidance to our 1:1 keyworkers working with the children. It is proven that early intervention is crucial in maximising the potential of children with disabilities, so we aim to offer intense support and therapy as soon as possible after referral. This helps prepare children for entry to the mainstream education system and minimise distress when the time comes.

2026 Chieftain

Q: What does it mean to return as Chieftain of the Gordonstoun Highland Games?

A: It's a real honour to be invited back. The Highland Games are such an important part of the Gordonstoun, and wider community and there's something very special about the atmosphere on the day.

As a parent of three children who attended the school, I spent many years on the sidelines watching the games unfold, and seeing the determination, the camaraderie and the pride that everyone takes in representing their schools, and I love the fact that this brings the local community together and creates a fantastic sense of shared celebration (and a little bit of friendly competition).

This year feels particularly meaningful as it is also reunion weekend for my son's year group, marking ten years since they left the school. Seeing former pupils return and reconnect with each other and with Gordonstoun is a reminder of just how strong the sense of community here really is.

To be asked to return as Chieftain feels a little like coming back into the family circle. It's a privilege to celebrate the students, the traditions of the school, and the wider community that gathers every year to support them.

Q: What makes the Gordonstoun Highland Games such a memorable event?

A: I think they capture the true spirit of Gordonstoun. It's not just about competition - although there is plenty of that, it's about participation, effort and community. You see young people throwing themselves into the traditional events with incredible determination, but you

also see the incredible skill display of the Pipe Band, everyone taking part in something, and local schools and families coming together to enjoy the day.

There is a wonderful energy to it all. You get the sense that everyone is included in some way, whether competing, performing, cheering or simply soaking up the atmosphere. It feels joyful, energetic and very much rooted in the values of the school.

Q: Why is Gordonstoun special to you?

A: Quite simply, it shaped the lives of our children at a time when we weren't expecting to temporarily move away from the area, and by extension, has shaped the lives of our whole family.

I have always particularly been a fan of the school's philosophy, which doesn't just focus on academic achievement but on character, resilience and service. As a parent, it was incredibly rewarding to watch our children grow in confidence through the experiences they had here, and also to know that there were many good people around to step in on our behalf when we couldn't be here.

Gordonstoun encourages young people to step away from their comfort zones, take responsibility for their actions, and discover what they are capable of, in a way that no other school I have seen does. Those lessons last a lifetime, and I think are increasingly important in the turbulent world we live in. I am very grateful that my children had the opportunity to experience that environment.

Q: How is the Gordonstoun's motto of 'plus est en vous', relevant to you?

A: "Plus est en vous" - there is more in you than you think, is a motto that resonates deeply with me - in fact there is a whole chapter of my book "Grounded" that is about going above and beyond, which demonstrates this.

Throughout my career in aviation, I have seen how often people underestimate their own capability. Flying aircraft, leading teams and making decisions under pressure all require you to trust yourself and step forward, even with things feel difficult.

More recently I experienced this very personally while climbing Mt Kilimanjaro. It was one of the hardest, and yet most rewarding things I have ever done, and there were certainly moments when I questioned whether or not I had what it would take to continue - especially on summit night, when I looked up and all I could see was a constant zig zag of head torches that seemed to continue to the stars. That phrase kept coming to mind though - and so I kept going, one foot in front of the other, slowly slowly - or Pole Pole, until I reached the summit.

I have also seen this in action through Project Wingman, the charity I founded in 2020 and ran until we closed it last year - thousands of aircrew coming together during the pandemic to support NHS staff across the UK, using their skills in new ways and proving that when circumstances demand it, we often discover strength and resilience we didn't know we had.

That idea - that we are capable of more than we realise - is something Gordonstoun has championed for generations, it's a philosophy that continues to guide me today, and it's the reason why, instead of fear being an excuse to say no to something, it's a reason to say yes!

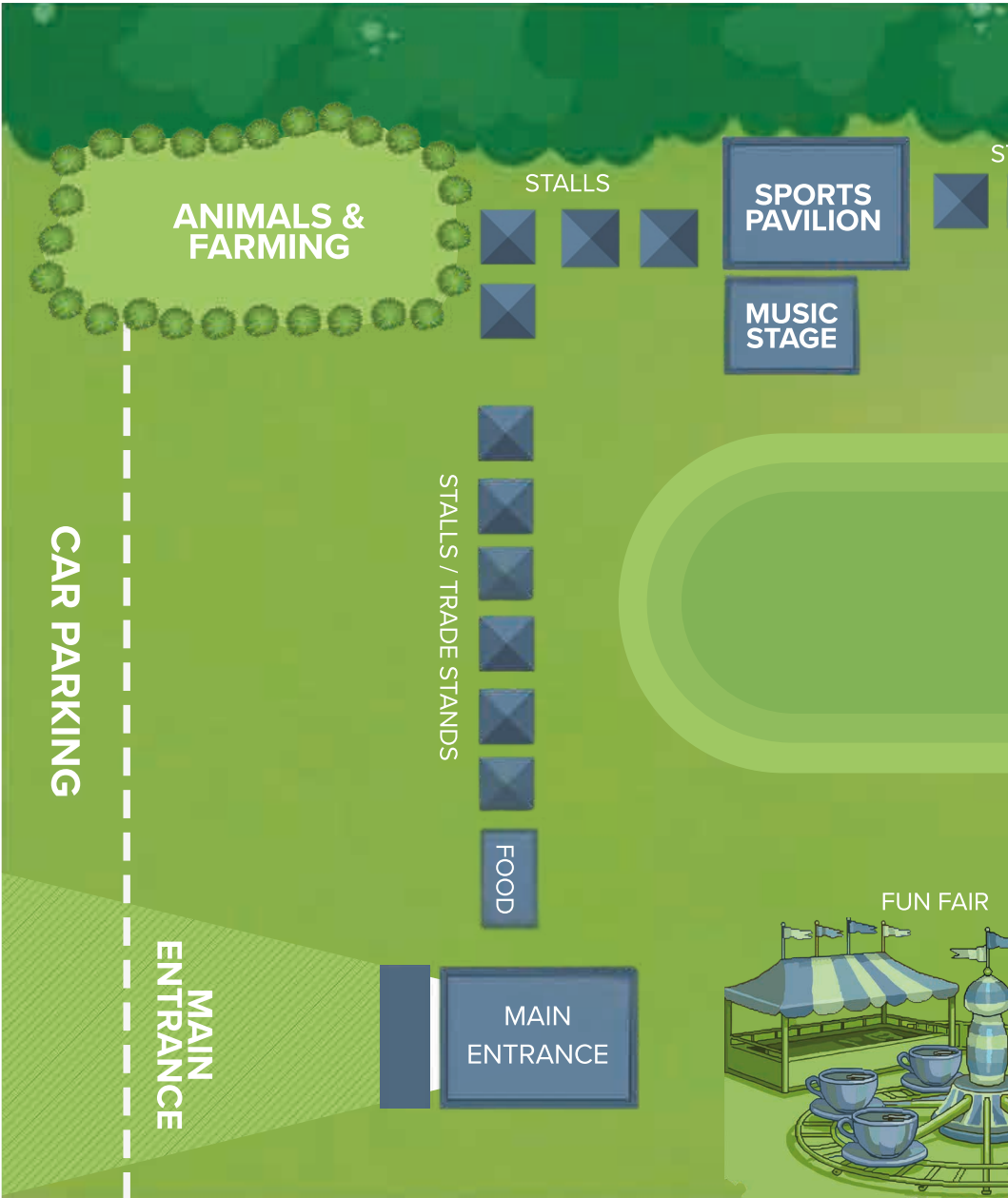

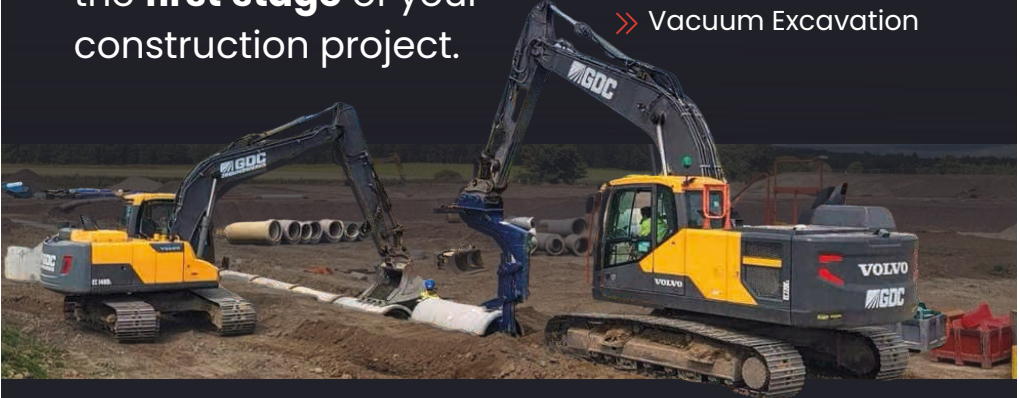

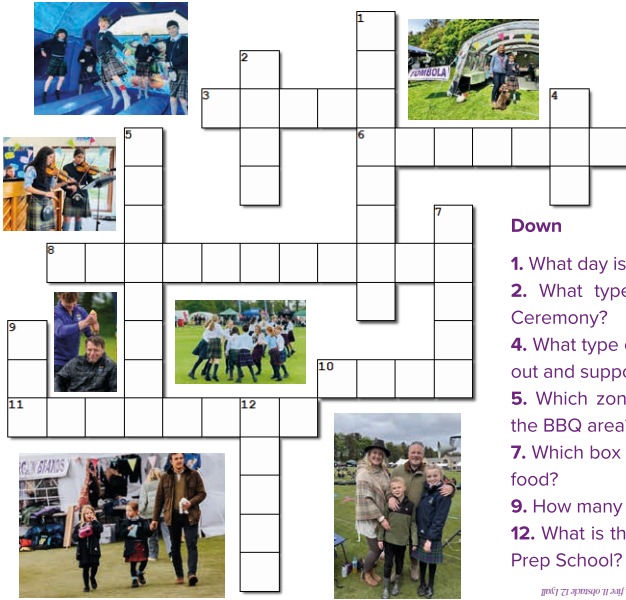
